PERFECT (have) + (verb)	An action that finished before another action or time in the past	An action that happened at an unsaid time in the past	An action that will finish before another action or time in the future
Verb Examples	had painted had driven	have/has painted have/has driven	will have painted will have driven
Sentence Examples	 He had painted the whole bathroom before I arrived. I had driven an hour when I ran out of gas. 	She has painted many portraits.You have driven race cars before.	 They will have painted the chair by lunchtime. We will have driven over 450 miles before we get to Santa Fe.
