Marriage is a strongly respected institution. Arranged marriages are still practiced to some degree. The head holds special honor and must not be touched. Shaking hands is not usual but when shaking hands, the right hand is supported by the left, as a sign of special respect.

Due to the severely inadequate medical systems in Burma, many folks rely on home remedies. Traditional beliefs normally still prevail, with malicious spirits being blamed for an illness and a shaman sought for treatment.

The Karenni are a resilient, gracious people with a great sense of humor. They have a very strong work ethic, and don't complain. They live out of a basic belief that life is difficult, so you do what you have to do in order to survive. If faced with a difficult task, they might respond with "a lay hey oh to' (it doesn't matter/ no problem). They demonstrate great dignity in providing for themselves and helping their fellow Karenni. They have a very strong commitment to their own country, language and culture. Unfortunately, it is very difficult for them to ask for help, even if they desperately need it. As you get to know the Karenni, ask them to tell you their stories. Do not call a Karenni a Burmese.

Rice is the key to a decent Karen day. Karen like white rice, not the brown unhusked variety. Karen are familiar with potatoes, which are boiled in soups or fried. Meats such as chicken, pork, or beef are popular, as are eggs. Canned fish is familiar and well liked.

The Karen are a reticent, even shy people, and many will be surprised and perhaps worried by American directness of speech, voice levels, and body language. With the Karen, a quiet, low-key style of communication works best, peppered with lots of reassuring and friendly smiles.

When a Karen folds his arms in front of him while talking to you, it is a sign of respect, not aggression or defensiveness. Using both hands to give and receive an object is a sign of respect, particularly with older people. Karen like to be very self-reliant and to pursue an independent lifestyle within their own culturally close-knit communities. If a Karen is offered something, he or she may be reluctant to take it, even if the item is needed. Karen do not like to boast or put themselves forward. They also do not like to complain. In Karen families, males are generally the heads of household. Elders are given the greatest respect. Karen are very loving yet quite strict with children, and many parents use their hand or a rod to discipline a child.

Many Karen are addicted to the simple pleasure of chewing betel nut, a mildly stimulating mixture of areca nut, lime, and leaf. So fond of this ancient Asian cultural practice are most older Karen that one elderly refugee said he would not go to the United States if he could not find betel there. Another elderly man had already begun to try to wean himself off betel by chewing melon seeds instead. Chewing gum might also work as a (pale) substitute. Dental caries are very common due to lack of access to dental care and common habit of chewing betel nut.

Do not call a Karen a Burmese.

The Congo is immersed in a warlike state where sexual violence is commonly used as a tactic of war, subjecting women to rape, mutilation, and public humiliation. Sexual violence against women and girls has caused international outrage since 1996, with little having been done about it since. Sexual and gender-based violence [SGBV] elicits physical and emotional complications. Pneumococcal disease (causing pneumonia meningitis and sepsis) is the second leading cause of child death under the age of 5. It is second only to malaria. In 2011 a vaccine was introduce in Kinshasa, Congo's capital as well as two of Congo's 11 provinces. In addition, malnutrition affects 3 out of every 10 children.

Ethiopian Key Information

The main health concerns in Ethiopia include maternal mortality, malaria, tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS compounded by acute malnutrition and lack of access to clean water and sanitation. Access to health-care services is very difficult. Polio and measles are a health issue and with the average distance of any given citizen to a health center being greater than 10 Km, vaccinations are not easily accessible.

Often times Ethiopians, will self-diagnose themselves as 'malarial' when in fact they are not, treating themselves as such, or relying on traditional medicines rather than Western medicines which again are frustratingly inconvenient. Cultural knowledge is useful in choosing therapy. It seems that Ethiopians would prefer a tuberculosis regimen that includes injections over tablets.

Eritreans are generally familiar with Western medicine and will typically seek help from a medical practitioner first. They may also use natural remedies in addition to medical care—it is important to ask specifically if the individual is taking any traditional medicines.

Eritrean men prefer to be cared for by male health care providers and women strongly wish to be cared for by female providers.

- Eritreans may be concerned with blood draws, fearing that too much blood is being drawn.
- There is an expectation that medicine will be prescribed for every illness

- Women in some of the refugee camps are at risk of sexual and gender-based violence, ranging from domestic violence to rape
- There is stigma associated with mental illness
- Hepatitis is generally understood through its symptoms and yellow skin and eyes and
 dark urine are associated with the disease. The traditional word for hepatitis, iff shwa,
 literally means bird disease and there is a traditional belief that hepatitis is caused by a

night bird or bat. To avoid confusion with the term bird disease, the term kabidy may be used, which literally means liver disease

- Political/Social infrastructure so disrupted in Somalia that people have little experience and may have unrealistic expectations
- Single parent households common (usually female headed)
- Many children
- Men and women do not usually change their name when they marry.
- Three part name: given name (first name), father's name, and paternal grandfather's name
- Food flat bread, goat, lamb, beef, camel, cereal or porridge, rice or noodles with sauce, beans, salad and fruits
- Milk is a staple for many Somalis, especially camel milk
- Ramadan—fasting from sun up to sun down
- Typical Somali diet does not meet USDA recommendations
